f you are a high school or homeschool senior whose parent or guardian is a member or employee of Choptank Electric Cooperative, you are eligible to apply to compete for the Choptank Electric Trust Scholarship which is distributed by the Choptank Electric Trust Board, a 501(c)(3) organization. Applicants must be entering a post-high school educational institution or technical/ trade school as a freshman in the fall of 2022.

The Choptank Electric Trust Board distributes nine \$2,000 scholarships every May and scholarship recipients are selected based on a combination of the following criteria:

- ✓ Financial need
- ✓ Academic achievement
- ✓ Extracurricular and community activities
- ✓ References
- ✓ Personal essay

The required essay should be limited to two typed, double-spaced pages on the following topic: "Why I have chosen to continue my education and how this scholarship will assist me."

lectric cooperatives in Virginia, Maryland and Delaware are preparing to accept applications for their popular scholarship from high school seniors who intend to pursue higher education studies.

The scholarships are awarded by the Virginia, Maryland & Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives' (VMDAEC) Education Scholarship Foundation which, since 2001, has provided almost 800 scholarships to graduating high school students totaling more than \$800,000.

"This program has helped hundreds of students advance their education and demonstrates once again how electric cooperatives

are committed to their memberconsumers and the communities they serve," says Brian Mosier, president and CEO of the VMD Association.

The application opens Tuesday, February 1, with the application deadline on Friday, April 1, 2022. Award recipients will be notified no later than May. The online application and information is posted at <u>vmdaec.com/</u> <u>scholarship.</u>

Any high school or homeschooled senior graduating in spring 2022, and whose primary residence is served by Choptank Electric Cooperative, is eligible to apply for a \$1,000 scholarship to be applied to a two or four year college or trade school.

An applicant must be entering his or her first semester at a postsecondary or technical/trade school in the fall of 2022. Scholarship funds, which will be sent directly

to the educational institution, must be used toward tuition, student fees, room and board, or textbooks.

To be considered complete, SAT and/or ACT score reports must come from the College Board. A score report must be uploaded by the student in the online application system. Scores listed on transcripts do not qualify. If a student has taken the SAT more than once, he or she can take the best score from each test ("Super Score"), but both tests must be submitted in the package to qualify.

The Foundation's board of directors will select recipients based on these weighted criteria: financial need at 40%, academic achievement at 40% and personal statement at 20%.

The scholarships are named in honor of Hudson, the Foundation's first chairman and former chairman of the board of directors of Mecklenburg Electric Cooperative in Chase City, VA.

Phil Wood is a man of few words, but we wish him well as he enters retirement and starts to pursue other activities which include traveling and spending time with his grandchildren.



Getting Back to "Normal" at the Maryland General Assembly

2022 session features new leadership

General he Maryland Assembly begins the 443rd Legislative Session on the second Wednesday in January. Much of pre-COVID public participation will be restored this year. Legislators will meet in person with citizens and advocates permitted to participate live in daily activities. During the 90day session, 188 elected officials will consider almost 3,000 bills. The 2022 session occurs during an election year and is expected to be dominated by discussion legislative re-districting of and spending programs.

The 2022 session will also

feature new leadership on the **Economic Matters** Committee. the House Committee with jurisdiction over most bills that impact energy. electricity and the laws that guide the Cooperative. Long-serving Chairman Dereck

Davis has been selected by the Legislature to become the next State Treasurer, replacing Nancy Kopp, who announced her retirement in October.

Delegate C.T. Wilson, of Charles County in southern Maryland, is the new Chairman of the Committee he has served on since 2015. Chairman Wilson was first elected to the House of Delegates in 2010. He is an Army veteran and a practicing attorney. He is familiar with the operation of electric cooperatives as SMECO serves his constituents in Charles County. Choptank Electric Cooperative will monitor all the bills introduced to identify those that may have an impact on the service we provide to cooperative members. Our goal continues to be affordable, reliable service to members.

We will continue to work closely with the Eastern Shore Delegation. These 16 legislators, who serve on various committees, caucus every Friday morning during session to protect the interests of the Eastern Shore. As winter brings her blustering winds and freezing temperatures, are you prepared? Here are some helpful tips to prepare your home, your travels, and your loved ones.

TIPS TO PREPARE YOUR HOME

- ✓ Insulate any water lines that run along exterior walls so your water supply will be less likely to freeze.
- Caulk and weather strip doors and windows.
- ✓ Insulate walls and attic.
- ✓ Install storm or thermal-pane windows or cover windows with plastic from the inside.
- Repair roof leaks and cut away tree branches that could fall on your home or other structure during a storm.

TIPS TO KEEP YOU AND YOUR FAMILY SAFE

- ✓ Stay off roads if at all possible. If trapped in your car, then stay inside.
- ✓ Limit your time outside. If you need to go outside, then wear layers of warm clothing.
- ✓ Watch for signs of frostbite and hypothermia.
- Reduce the risk of a heart attack by avoiding overexertion when shoveling snow and walking in the snow.
- ✓ Learn the signs and treatments for frostbite and hypothermia.

- ✓ Cell phone, portable charger, and extra batteries

- ✓ Windshield scraper, shovel and hazard or other reflectors
- ✓ Booster cables with fully charged battery or jumper cables
- ✓ Battery-powered radio with extra batteries
- ✓ Flashlight with extra batteries
- ✓ Road maps, water and snacks
- ✓ First-aid kit with any necessary medications and a pocket knife
- ✓ Bright-colored flag or help signs, emergency distress flag, and/or emergency flares
- ✓ Waterproof matches and a can to melt snow for water
