Every year, Choptank Electric sends five high school juniors on a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Washington, D.C., which includes the opportunity to meet members of Congress and senators, visit the U.S. Capitol Visitor's Center, tour the Capitol building, visit local memorials and museums, and other historic sites. Youth Tour representatives are selected by Choptank Electric based on an application, a 90-second first-round, self-produced video, a short essay, and, if applicable, a second-round interview. To qualify for this opportunity, students must be juniors whose parents or guardians are Choptank Electric members. Applications are due by 4:30 p.m. Friday, January 31, 2020. All expenses are paid for by Choptank Electric.

Choptank Electric Recruits Talented VP of Engineering

Choptank Electric recently hired Leroy Sverduk as the new Vice President of Engineering Services. He began his duties on September 16, 2019.

Sverduk was Delaware Electric Cooperative's Manager of Metering and Power Supply. Sverduk was at Delaware Electric since 2011 where he was originally hired as a Systems Engineer. Before joining Delaware, he led research in underwater electromagnetic sensor and sensor systems for the Office of Naval Research and Naval Surface Warfare Center in Carderock, Maryland, as an electronics engineer.

Carl Widdowson's 39-Year Legacy Comes to a Close

After 39 years of dedicated service, Carl R. Widdowson retired from the Choptank Electric Board of Directors on August 27, 2019.

Throughout his outstanding career, he served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for Choptank Electric from 1983-2013 (30 years), the Maryland Representative to the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) board from 1993-2010 (17 years), and as Director representing Choptank Electric on the Old Dominion Electric Cooperative (ODEC) board from 1987-2016 (29 years).

Widdowson represented Somerset County where his family farm is located near Princess Anne. He owns and operates a grain farm with his son, Wayne Widdowson.

A long-time member of American Legion Post 94, he is also a member of the First Baptist Church of Princess Anne and the Somerset County Planning and Zoning Commission. He was also the Chairman of the Somerset County U.S. Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service Committee, a member of the Farm Bureau, and a member of the Somerset Ruritan Club.


