Our lineworker training facility in Salisbury is world-class. A partnership with Wor-Wic Community College that developed throughout 2022 will bring the first-ever pre-apprenticeship lineworker

We continued our high-speed internet build-out, offering broadband to thousands of families. Choptank is building infrastructure and connecting customers faster than any other provider on the Shore. By going to the most rural locations, we are meeting the needs of members who have been left behind by internet companies for too long.

CHOPTANK FIBER, LLC is a wholly owned

broadband subsidiary of Choptank Electric Cooperative. Choptank Fiber's goal is to install broadband one community at a time and then reinvest the monthly subscription revenue into the expense of infrastructure development in the next community, until we serve the entire rural Shore.

As Choptank Fiber becomes profitable, it will pay back the electric ratepayers. So, our electric ratepayers are making a small investment. In the end, we believe it will be a win for the electric co-op member and a win for the Eastern Shore as we take a step to solve the broadband problem.

This is the cooperative model of rural residents joining together to provide a much-needed service. It is being used across the country as many coops have begun to offer broadband service to members. Our financial model allows longer payback on investment than a for-profit company. On the electric side, we finance projects over 30 years. On the broadband side, if we plan a 10-year infrastructure development program, that is an acceptable term for us and for our banks.

HOW YOUR COOPERATIVE DOLLAR WAS SPENT













AVERAGE kWh RESIDENTIAL (MONTHLY)

Through the Choptank Electric Trust

One of the Seven Cooperative Principles is Concern for Community. As a Co-op, the quality of life for our members and the community has always been at the center of what we do. The Choptank Electric Trust is an affiliate of Choptank Electric Cooperative, governed by its own Board of Directors representing all nine counties on the Eastern Shore. The Trust donates to local organizations, charities and causes through Operation Round Up®, our community assistance program since 2004. Members who participate in this program 'round up' their monthly electric bills to the nearest dollar and donate the difference to our program, distributing the money in our local communities. In 2022, 94% of our members were enrolled in Operation Round Up[®].

The Choptank Electric Trust also authorizes donations to support community programs and historical efforts. A total of \$347,876 was granted by the Trust in 2022 to support our community with food, clothing, shelter, equipment, medical, and educational needs.

In February of 2022, a donation was made by the Trust to the Skipjack Heritage Museum for restoration efforts to the City of Crisfield skipjack. This historical boat is an artifact of the museum and is now completely restored, sailing around the Tangier Sound and Island to race and to provide educational tours for students.

The Trust also donated to Jesse's Paddle: The Jesse Klump Suicide Awareness Program, based in Worcester County. Jesse's Paddle established an awareness campaign on the lower Eastern Shore to promote the new 24/7 crisis and suicide phone line, 988.

Choptank Electric Cooperative continued to offer scholarship programs to help local students seeking higher education. Between the Luck of the Draw Scholarship, Choptank Electric Trust Scholarship, and the Virginia, Maryland & Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives (VMDAEC) Scholarship, over \$29,000 was awarded to more than 20 deserving students across the Eastern Shore.


In partnership with the VMDAEC, we were able to take five high school juniors on a "Mini Youth Tour" in June of 2022. We toured in and around the James River in Virginia and learned about the impact electric cooperatives have on our

communities. Students experienced national museums, memorials, theme parks, and learned about the industry at Community Electric Cooperative in Windsor, VA.

While traveling and supporting local county fairs, festivals, and a variety of other events in 2022, we met with many members to talk about broadband internet and the future of Choptank Electric Cooperative. Supporting our local schools and fire departments, we also participated in hotline demonstrations, school presentations, career fairs and Junior Achievement to reach the future of our industry.
